# BEARFACTS

## Barbour, West Virginia

### 1992–2002

Barbour is one of 55 counties in West Virginia. It is not part of statistical area. Its 2002 population of 15,551 ranked 36th in the state.

#### PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002, Barbour had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,798. This PCPI ranked 43rd in the state, and was 79 percent of the state average, \$23,794, and 61 percent of the national average, \$30,906. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.1 percent from 2001. The 2001–2002 state change was 3.1 percent and the national change was 1.2 percent. In 1992, the PCPI of Barbour was \$12,204 and ranked 44th in the state. The average annual growth rate of PCPI over the past 10 years was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002, Barbour had a total personal income (TPI) of \$292,333\*. This TPI ranked 37th in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 5.9 percent from 2001. The 2001–2002 state change was 3.3 percent and the national change was 2.3 percent. In 1992, the TPI of Barbour was \$192,338\* and ranked 35th in the state. The average annual growth rate of TPI over the past 10 years was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income (TPI) includes net earnings by state of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and current transfer receipts received by the residents of Barbour. In 2002, net earnings accounted for 53.1 percent of TPI (compared with 51.4 percent in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.8 percent (compared with 15.7 percent in 1992); and transfer receipts were 32.2 percent (compared with 32.9 percent in 1992). From 2001 to 2002, net earnings increased 5.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.6 percent; and transfer receipts increased 9.0 percent. From 1992 to 2002, net earnings increased on average 4.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.6 percent; and transfer receipts increased on average 4.0 percent.

#### EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings by persons employed in Barbour increased from \$104,251\* in 2001 to \$111,814\* in 2002, an increase of 7.3 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.5 percent and the national change was 1.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$87,605\* to the 2002 estimate was 2.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.8 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
